Vineland Quarry Rehabilitation Tour

In September, Walker hosted the Niagara Hamilton branch of the Ontario Institute of Agrologists. The group was interested in the rehabilitation efforts at our sites, specifically our Edgerock Vineyard at Vineland Quarry. We were joined by Megalomaniac Winery to guide the tour of the vineyard while speaking to Walker's history, operations, and progressive rehabilitation efforts.

Walker at Work

South Niagara Hospital Construction

Walker continues to support critical infrastructure initiatives throughout the Niagara region, with safe and responsible operations as a top priority.

This summer and fall Walker Construction had two major reconstruction projects ongoing in Beamsville. The Aberdeen & of a new storm sewer system, pre-cast concrete headwalls, culvert replacements, armour stone retaining walls and hot mix asphalt paving. Durham Road in Beamsville had a full depth road reconstruction, culvert installations and replacements, two stormwater retention systems, concrete

Hospital, with stone supplied by Walker being used to upgrade the infrastructure to the new hospital site. Walker stone is also being used in the site servicing and ongoing

Walker supplied stone to Riverfront in Niagara Falls. So far, 60K tonnes have been supplied with approximately another 40K to go. In addition, stone was used for new subdivisions in Fort Erie and Thorold, resurfacing Hwy 405 for the MTO, construction for a new school being built on McLeod Road in Niagara Falls, and construction for a new commercial building in St. Catharines to support growth in the region.

Walker stone was also supplied for the job of a new Hydrogen plant in Niagara Falls, which

Hillside Drive project included the installation hydrant installations, widening of a roadway, curbs, and hot mix asphalt paving.

Momentum continues at the South Niagara construction of the new hospital.

New Crushing Plant is Operational

The new crushing plant is now operational at Ridgemount Quarry. This new, portable plant provides flexibility to move processing closer to the area that the stone is being extracted from and helps reduce truck traffic within the site. There is also the potential for making more products in the future. Part of the crusher was repurposed from the Walker Brothers Quarry, when the tertiary crusher was disassembled.



12-Mile Creek **Restoration Project**

Walker remains committed to being a strong supporter of local environmental projects and donated aggregates to the Niagara Peninsula Conservation Authority to help restore areas of the severely eroded 12-Mile Creek. This project is a true demonstration of community collaboration and will protect the unique habitat of the native Brook Trout.
