Recognition in the Industry

Walker is proud to receive the Rehabilitation Award from the Ontario Stone, Sand & Gravel Association (OSSGA) for its Gowanlock Pit. The site has been rehabilitated back to agricultural use over the last 15 years. In 2024, final rehabilitation work was conducted with topsoil applied, and fertilizer spread across the area, and as of 2025, it will be rented to an adjacent farmer. The Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) inspected and confirmed that the site met rehabilitation requirements in October 2024.


